

PINOT NOIR 2014

Winemaker's Notes

A blend of two regions and vineyards in Tasmania. The Derwent Valley produces deeply coloured Pinot Noir of rich intensity, brooding dark voluptuous styles. These Pinot fruit shows dark cherry, strawberry fruit characters, mineral acidity, firm tannin structure and commensurate length of palate. Whilst fruit from the Cranbrook area is more blueberry, steely, yet perfumed, tannins can be gruff, but with superb length.

This intricate Pinot Noir shows dark fruits of blueberry and cherry, it has a rich, complex flavour profile all wrapped in silky tannins and impeccable length of flavour.

Very powerful, complex aromas of blueberry fruit, cherries and spice complemented by hints of oak
